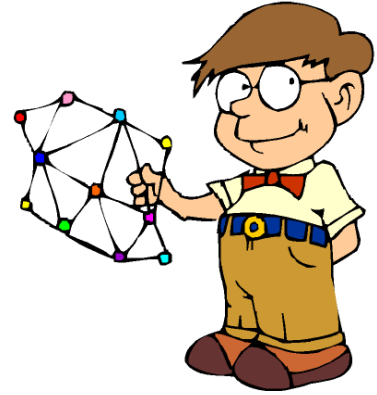


Science Report

Trade Hints:




- The title should tell what the report is about.
- Explain your method of study.
- Make a list of the books you used for your report.
- Make sure the first sentence of your report introduces the topic you are studying.
- The last sentence should be a clearly stated conclusion.
- Include illustrations that add to what you write.

- Project notes from 2 or more books you used for information
- A lot of information
- Report is well organized and easy to understand.
- Correct spelling and grammar

Notes	Your notes indicate that you used 2 or more sources of information.	Your notes indicate that you used less than 2 sources of information.	Your notes are incomplete and lack required information.
Spelling	All spellings are correct.	Some spelling errors are present.	Many spelling errors are present.
Content	You wrote in complete sentences. You provided a lot of information. Your report is well organized and easy to understand. Your readers will learn a lot.
